

The 3 Main Debates in Developmental Psychology

Debate #1 - Nature vs. Nurture

Nature: We genetically inherit our physical traits from our prents but we also inherit personality traits, intelligence and preferences.

Debate #2 - Continuity vs. Discontinuity

Continuity: This is a way of explaining our development. Continuity is explained as development being a continuous journey. For example, a child learns to crawl, then walk, then run.

Discontinuity: This is explaining development through different stages. For example, in Piaget's Developmental Stages Theory, the baby goes from the sensorimotor stage where they do not have object permanence (the idea that if you can't see something it is still there) to the preoperational stage where they understand that even if Mom plays peek a boo that she is behind the hands.
